If your proposal is accepted, your speakers will be required to submit the final papers to the workshop by the same deadline as that of the regular contributed papers.

- Summary of the special session topic

Invited Paper Information

For each invited paper in the special session (5-7 papers total), please provide:

- Tentative paper title and a short abstract
- List of authors
